## **California Native Plant Society, Santa Clara Valley Chapter Guidelines for Resolving Conflicts**

## **Chapter Code of Conduct**

- 1. Be respectful of every person's input.
- 2. Use problem-solving methods that support everyone.
- 3. Welcome new members and new ideas.
- 4. The good of the chapter and conservation must always be considered.
- 5. Chapter guidelines on representing CNPS-SCV externally must be followed.

## **Principles for Resolution**

- Chapter work must be done according to scientific principles. Establish current reference materials and authorities for best practices. Consult with state CNPS when applicable
- 2. More than one method may work. Does any given method do more harm than good?
- 3. Teamwork is vital. If deviation is not egregious one must tolerate the annoyances common to working in groups.
- 4. Balance is important. For example, enforcing one method may be simple, but one must also give volunteers room to exercise creativity (within scientific guidelines and evidence-based evaluation).

Each committee should follow these guidelines in its operations. If a conflict arises the Executive Committee should be asked to mediate and resolve the conflict.
